The Ambassador Award is presented to a person who has worked to promote better relations between the people of the Republic of Ireland and the people of the United States.

Catherine B. Shannon, PhD, Emerita Professor of History at Westfield State University is a prolific researcher, writer and educator. Her scholarship is focused on Modern Irish and Irish American history. Dr Shannon retired as a professor in 2000. During the Troubles Dr. Shannon was an important American advocate for peace in Northern Ireland. In 1982, Dr. Shannon organized the first Symposium on Northern Ireland that brought Irish and British representatives together to discuss the political issues of the time. The event was held at the John F. Kennedy Library in Boston. There were three symposiums held over the years and these events lead the way for peace in Northern Ireland. Dr. Shannon remains active in many organizations and causes fostering strong Irish and American relations.
