ANNUAL PARADE – SUNDAY MARCH 17, 2019

The Holyoke St. Patrick's Parade represents, in grand tradition, the celebration of the patron Saint of Ireland, Saint Patrick. With this in mind, each participating unit in the Parade must adhere to the Parade Standards and Regulations of the Parade Committee, in general, and the Float Committee specifically.

FLOAT STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS

(Excerpted from St. Patrick's Committee of Holyoke, Inc. Parade Standards and Regulations)

1. All floats must be approved by the Float Committee before entering the line-of-march. The Parade Committee retains the right to reject float designs that in its sole opinion do not reflect the theme of the Parade.
2. Each float must adhere at all times to one of four themes symbolic of the Parade: IRISH, RELIGIOUS, PATRIOTIC, and OPEN.
3. For safety reasons, it is recommended floats do not exceed fourteen (14) feet in height to an absolute maximum of fifteen (15) feet in height.
4. For maneuverability, it is recommended that each float unit be no more than forty (40) feet in length, and that the width of the float be such that it will move freely along the parade route and be able to negotiate required turns.
5. Any float that breaks down and cannot proceed in the Parade shall be immediately removed to the nearest side street. If the breakdown is repaired, the float will be allowed to re-enter the Parade after the last unit has passed, or at the direction of Parade / Float Coordination officials.
6. At no time shall a float enter the line-of-march until instructed to do so by a properly identified Parade / Float Coordination official in the staging area.
7. Lettering of the name of the float sponsor must be in harmony with the general theme of the float and will be a factor in judging the float.
8. Floats will enter the line-of-march only after it has been determined by Parade / Float Committee officials that the float conforms to the rules governing participants, passed the safety inspection, and obtains approval of the censors of the Parade.
9. The right is reserved to remove any float from the line-of-march at any time, for safety reasons, for indecorous behavior, or for structural instability.
10. Samples of merchandise, candy, or other articles are prohibited from being thrown or handed out from floats, or distributed by other persons associated with the float and/or unit while the Parade is in progress. Float riders and out-walkers may not solicit anything from Parade viewers. Violation of this policy will result in immediate ejection from the Parade route, with no consideration given to future invitations for Parade participation.
11. The Parade / Float Committee must be advised in advance, during the float application process, regarding **sound and music amplification** or other noise of any kind, or type, etc. to be used on the float as it may compete or interfere with live bands marching ahead or behind the float. This also includes such things as Profanity and other inappropriate language usage.

NOTE; Excessive music volume or nuisance disruption to the other Floats and the Judging area may

result in REMOVAL from the Parade, if request made from Float Chair or his delegate to reduce the volume or cease the disruptions is NOT followed.

12. No person is permitted to ride on a float in the Parade other than those selected and designated, by the float sponsor, to be in the Parade.
13. So the float sponsor may receive the full benefit of participation in the Parade, it is agreed that a full and complete description of the float entered in the Parade shall be delivered to the Float Committee no later than Jan. 31st. This information is used to provide proper credit and exposure during the television broadcast as well as any pre-Parade publicity that may be undertaken by the Parade Committee. This information is also used to determine placement of the float in the line-of-march. The description should include the approximate height, width, and length along with any unique facts that can assist in describing the float during the television broadcast.
14. Safety precaution: Legally, the tail pipe of each float must have a fireproof extension that extends at least six (6) inches beyond the float skirt.
15. Judging of all floats will occur prior to the start of the Parade at the float staging area. All floats should be in the float staging area (lower lot, US Rte. 5, Holyoke Charter School) by 8:00 A.M. on Parade Day. Award designations for winning floats will be placed on the front of the floats, as well as trophies distributed, at the start of the Parade. Float information must be received by the Parade / Float Committee no later than the FEB 28th for the float to be qualified for judging.
16. To receive the greatest possible television coverage, the main theme of the float should be facing forward and to the left, towards TV cameras. Consequently the rear aspect of the float should be the highest point of attention.
17. Liability and Insurance: (a) The St. Patrick's Committee of Holyoke, Inc. carries general liability insurance to protect itself against claims arising from its events and activities. The Parade Committee coverage does not extend to provide protection for float sponsors, builders, or other participants.

(b) The Parade Committee requires each float, float sponsor, and builder be insured by a general liability insurance policy, with a no deductible clause, from a company approved by the Parade Committee, for a minimum limit of \$500,000 per occurrence and a policy limit of \$1,000,000. This may be accomplished by the float sponsor or builder carrying the insurance and providing the Parade Committee with a certificate of insurance certifying the required policies of insurance have been issued and specifically naming the St. Patrick's Committee of Holyoke, Inc. as an additional insured. The certificate of insurance shall be delivered to the Parade / Float Committee three (3) weeks prior to the Parade.
18. Please refer to the St. Patrick's Committee of Holyoke, Inc. Parade Standards and Regulations for additional information.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. Vehicles used in the Parade as a float towing vehicle must submit evidence of a valid registration and valid insurance coverage for the vehicle to the Parade / Float Committee.
2. Vehicles used in the Parade as float towing vehicle, which have business names or commercial advertising imprinted or mounted on the vehicle, must remit payment of a \$500 advertising charge to the Parade Committee prior to the Parade.

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FLOAT JUDGING INFORMATION

For your information:

There are four themes for floats in the parade from which you choose to be judged. They are as follows:

1. IRISH (Float is reflective of an Irish based theme)
2. RELIGIOUS (Float is reflective of a religious based theme)
3. PATRIOTIC (Float is reflective of a patriotic / military based theme)
4. OPEN (Float theme does not specifically fit one of the above themes)

You choose the theme for your float entry on the FLOAT JUDGING FORM.

Float judging on Parade Day is based on the following criteria:

1. CONSTRUCTION (Quality of construction, structural soundness) – 30%
2. BEAUTY (Overall beauty of the entire float) – 50%
3. DESIGN (Adaptability to the chosen theme for judging) – 20%
